1825 Mountain View Lane – John and Elsie Parsons House

The John and Elsie Parsons House, a 1 and ½ story Craftsman Bungalow Style House built circa 1915, is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The house features a front gable roof with wood shingles, wide overhanging eaves with exposed rafters, and decorative triangle brackets. The full width front porch has a shed roof with central dormer supported with square piers support and wooden railing. The house has stucco siding and horizontal board in the gable ends and windows are double hung multi-panes over one wood sash.

The John and Elsie Parsons House is an excellent and well-preserved example of Taylor Process Hollow Concrete Wall construction in Forest Grove, Oregon. The house was built by John Taylor in 1920. It was nominated to the National Register in association with the *Taylor Process Hollow Concrete Construction in Forest Grove, Oregon* Multiple Property Submission.
