### 2137 College Way – Pacific University – Bates House

The Bates House is an interesting example of a large Craftsman Style Bungalow. It was built in 1923 to be the home of presidents of Pacific University. The designers were Levi Sparks and Al Redetske, the designers of McCormick Hall. The 2-story building features a side gable roof with a gable dormer and a large full width hip roofed porch on the west façade. There are large wood framed windows on either sides of the entry door. A polygonal bay window projects above the porch roof on the second floor. Sidelights frame the front entry door. It is named in honor of Dr. Henry Liberty Bates, who was a former Dean of Faculty at the University and had also been the principal of Tualatin Academy from 1893 to 1915.
