

Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

The heart of this house is similar to many other late 19th century Forest Grove houses. It has a canted window bay, wide dropped siding with cornerboards & watertable and 1/1 DHS windows. These basics are overshadowed by two large additions, the first a gable roof extension to the S, the second a shed addition to the east.

The house is in good condition, but the additions have changed the feel of the house.

Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

It is a good guess to assume that Margaret Smith and her daughter Maggie were occupants of this house in 1900. On the 1900 census, only 4 families lived on Block 20 and 3 of them, Baber, Thomas, and Large, are all linked to other houses on the block. 1804 Douglas is the only other pre-1900 house on the block and the Smith's were the 4th family on the 1900 census for this block.

Margaret Smith was born in 1816 in Kentucky. Her parents were also born in Kentucky, indicating that her grandparents were among the late 18th century settlers in Kentucky. Smith was widowed and living with Maggie (b. 1855, Illinois), one of her 7 living children in 1900, at 1804 Douglas.

The house is a simple vernacular farmhouse that reflects the popular styles of the day. A polygonal window bay on the front elevation gives the house a simple Italianate look. Another rectangular window bay is on the north elevation. Shiplap siding covers the entire house, and 2/2 DHS windows are still extant. The only major alteration is the breezeway that links the house and garage on the W elevation.
