

Volunteer Advocate for Adults Living in Long Term Care

Long Term Care Ombudsmen are free, confidential advocates to help with any large or small problem bothering someone living in a nursing home, assisted living, residential care or adult foster home (for example, poor care, disrespectful treatment, cold coffee, medication errors, threatened eviction, financial exploitation). Screened, trained, and backed by state staff, the volunteers visit licensed homes and/or respond to calls from anyone concerned and, with the resident's OK, go to work to solve the problem. The need is especially great in the Forest Grove area, it is important and rewarding work with flexible hours, but the program needs far more volunteers.
