

The City is looking at options for a new police facility. Over the next few FYI's, the City will be publishing facts and figures about the current facility and how police utilize it to provide services to the community.



## Did you know...???

The Forest Grove Police station is not only the headquarters for patrol officers, the building also houses the FGPD detective unit, administrative offices, records and support staff, as well as areas for evidence processing and storage, booking and temporary holding cells for those placed under arrest, records processing and storage, interviewing suspects and witnesses, and a front office/lobby area open to members of the public.

The current building has one primary workspace for patrol – four computer workstations from which to conduct their regular business, such as report writing, making calls, or conducting assigned investigations. This same space is also used for patrol briefings, equipment checkout, and department meetings.

There is only one interview room in the current FGPD station. The room is used for interviewing those suspected of criminal activity, but, due to space and privacy, the same space must be used for interviewing witnesses and taking statements from crime victims. The FGPD currently has two holding cells in our booking area. These cells can only be used for a maximum of four hours and may not be used to lodge juvenile offenders.

The police station has an underground gun range regularly utilized by sworn staff who are required by the state, for certification purposes, to qualify regularly with their firearm.

On the average day, it's not uncommon for the lobby to have a constant stream of visitors here for various reasons: seeking police assistance, reporting criminal activity, requesting records or police reports, picking up (or turning in) property, meeting with officers or detectives for investigations, applying for noise or event permits, or updating information (such as sex offender registrations).

In early 2015, the lobby of the Forest Grove Police Department was significantly reduced to make room for two new workstations now occupied by the FGPD's Code Enforcement Officer and Community Outreach Specialist.

As of July 1, 2019, the City of Forest Grove will offer rebates to residential customers who

Parklets are an innovative and cost-effective way to add public gathering space with such amenities as seating, plantings, and public art in a privately-funded and privately-maintained public space. Parklets are also a method for supporting the downtown business community by creating a more attractive commercial corridor, fostering social engagement, and providing enhancements that contribute to livability and attracting pedestrians.

Parklets are a new concept to many small towns, but they have been successful enhancements to larger cities around the country for several years. The first parklet was conceived and installed in San Francisco, CA in 2010. It is now an annual program there, and has also been initiated in Oregon cities such as Milwaukie, Eugene, Astoria, and Newberg. The Forest Grove program will be among the first in small towns, and is modeled after these successful programs.
